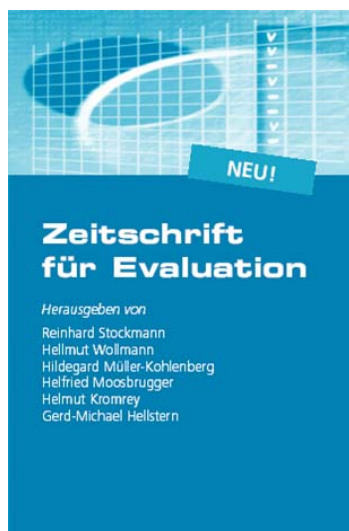

Abstract

The so-called “Verbleibsquote” (VBQ) indicates the share of participants in active labour market policies who are not registered as unemployed six months after leaving the programme. Therefore it can be seen as a gross-effect of these measures. Using the VBQ as a controlling indicator to measure the causal reintegration success of active labour market policies has been criticised some time now. Nevertheless it is still the only indicator which is available on short-term and can therefore provide relevant information for the Public Employment Service to adjust policies. Comparing the VBQ with estimated net-effects of job creation schemes shows that even a rate over 50% can be connected with negative net-effects. But it can also be shown that the VBQ is highly correlated with the estimated net-effects. We use this relation to simulate VBQ which can be associated with positive net-effects.
